Overview: This year we will be building on the skills you have learned in your previous math courses and learn new concepts including functions (linear, exponential, quadratic), statistics, solving equations and inequalities. GENERAL INFORMATION

Student Engagement:

Opportunities for student engagement will be available throughout the quarter by attending Smart Lunch, making test corrections, and participating in classroom activities. You must keep track of your **Student Engagement Sheet** and turn it in at the end of the quarter for a grade. Reminder, Student Engagement is worth 10% of your overall grade.

Homework:

You will be assigned homework **each week** that will be due every Sunday by midnight. The homework assignment will be available on Canvas and you will have 2 attempts to complete it. Your final grade will be the higher of the 2 attempts.

Quiz/Test:

There will be at least one **QUIZ** per unit. One **TEST** will be given per unit and will consist of both multiple choice and short answer questions.

CANVAS:

The Canvas website gives you access to all of the materials that will be used in class as well as instructional videos that coincide with each lesson. Please make sure you know how to sign in to your Canvas account.

REMEDIATION:

Remediation is an opportunity to improve test grades. In order to be eligible for remediation you must accurately complete test corrections on the previous test by the date of the new unit test. Each unit test will contain questions from the previous unit. The new and previous test grades will be averaged together and will replace the previous test grade if the new test grade is higher.
